CD's

J. Phillips made a motion to approve renewing CD #30403927 & #30403950 at Clinton National Bank; seconded by T. Franzen. All ayes. Motion carried. Mayor Hansen stated that CD rates are up at other banks. We should try to shop around since the rates were considerably higher. CNB did notify the City that they would match the percentage.

GTSB Agreement

H. Kramer made a motion to approve the GTSB Agreement; seconded by T. Franzen. All ayes. Motion carried.

Cooperation Agreement- Department of the Army and City of Sabula

H. Kramer made a motion to approve the Cooperation Agreement Between the Department of the Army and City of Sabula; seconded by J. Phillips. All ayes. Motion carried. An agreement was required to begin repair work on the levee due to wave erosion this spring.

Work Session

T. Woodhurst asked if a work session was needed to discuss the utility rates. It was decided to wait until budget time to figure costs.

North Boat Ramp

T. Woodhurst asked council about selling the dock at the north boat ramp. The City had purchased a new one. It was decided to wait until spring to post for sale.

School Property

Council discussed the school property. H. Kramer mentioned that he had a conversation with a school board member and was told that the City needed to do something soon if they were interested in the property. Mayor and council decided to move forward on this and form a committee to hash out the details. We should have a couple council members, the mayor, 2 school board members and reps from the school. No motion was necessary.

D. Ward made a motion to place on file the Sewer and Water Maintenance Report, Financial Statement and Expenditure and Revenue and Expenditure Report for August; seconded by J. Phillips. All ayes. Motion carried.

Police report

During this month of September, we received 28 miscellaneous aid-information calls, 86 officerinitiated call, 2 assisted with the ambulance/fire department, 2 motor vehicle accidents, 6 assists with county or other agency, 3 requested assistance from other agency, 20 police citations issued, 2 arrest made, 2 pending cases for investigation, 8 warnings given on miscellaneous violations, 1 case for further investigation and 12 reports taken. 114 total police involved events.
